DOOR PRIZES AWARDED: There were 3 door prizes awarded.

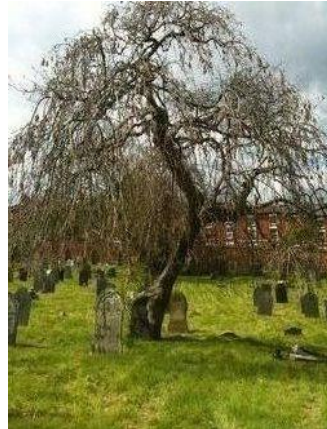

Boyington who proclaimed his innocence also claimed an oak tree would grow from his gravesite to prove his innocence. A tree did grow, exists today.

As we congratulate the Baldwin County Genealogical Society on 35th anniversary . . .

As a member of the Baldwin County Genealogical Society from early beginnings, I remember well the encouragement of founders, Dorothy "Dot" Brown, Berdine Rittenhouse, and their cohort husbands, to establish a library for researchers beginning with donated books from Dot and Berdine's personal libraries, as well as early members such as Jo Ann McCay's and Evan Stohl's, housed in the Baldwin County Heritage Museum. We soon outgrew the space as well as needed hours to access. **The Foley Public Library was approached, history has been written.**

In-house 'yard' sales and booths at the Elberta Sausage Festival, the 'penny cup', generous monetary donations from folks like Harold and Clareen Wells, buying book shelves, file cabinets, oh, the wonderful support, work, monies from the Society in issuing years.

As of March 3, 2022, the **Alabama, Local History & Genealogy Collections** department of the Foley Public Library houses the largest collection in the Baldwin County; the cataloged collection numbering 15,625 items. *That does not include* the thousands of Family Surname Files, the Baldwin County History Files, the on-going Dorothy Lehmann Leech Obituary Collection, the Map Collection, 800 plus microfilm, and the three carts of material waiting to be cataloged. It also does not count the recent donations from the estate of **Dorothy "Dot" Skipper Brown** and from the Library of **Marjorie Katherine DeVan Weber** listed in this newsletter.

It has been thirty years since I came on staff with the Foley Public Library, not long before an awesome young director, Molly Peterson, who recognized immediately the need to expand, encourage Genealogy. Today, the Society and the Library assists in thousands of requests by email, facebook, telephone, mail, and researchers to our department all the *while the Society continues* their programs/ workshops, BCGS volunteers in help in research, one such is professional genealogist Lois Marie O'Kenok.

Director John Jackson continues to encourage and expand the Collections, with grants, purchases, and today in assessing what is needed as we plan our **new three-story library building**, city plans in motion now. This department will include more computers, larger work area, special collections and archival storage areas, larger file workroom for Family Surnames and Baldwin County Histories, obituaries, enclosed area for the two state of the art scanners, (results of a grant). The list can go on and on...

So congratulations to the Society's beginning, present, and very much so, the future ...job well done, folks, job well done. am so proud of us.
